

Cheryl Heming

Cheryl Heming has been involved with the local ecosystems of the Red River Valley of Manitoba for over 30 years

As City Naturalist for the City of Winnipeg from 1993 until 2008, she changed the focus of her Branch from interpretive and school tours to the protection, enhancement and preservation of natural heritage and ecologically significant natural lands within Winnipeg. She was responsible for about a 1000 hectares of these areas in the city with respect to inventory, assessment, preservation, management and environmental education. Beginning with one tall grass prairie restoration project in the early 90's, multi-partnership habitat and restoration projects numbered between 20 and 40 on an annual basis.

She was also a part of the committee team that produced the unique book Naturescape Manitoba. This book promotes our unique prairie ecosystem and took almost a decade to produce.

Currently, Cheryl is the Coordinator for the Invasive Species Council of Manitoba and a Senior Biologist at Dillon Consulting. She has a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and a Management Certificate from the University of Manitoba.
